Monday 16th January - All second year pupils will visit the Hob's Moat Archaeological site for which STURDY FOOTWEAR will be required. A short tour of the site will be given by the Archaeologist.

OPTIONAL ACTIVITIES

All second year pupils will spend Tuesday 17th, Wednesday 18th and Thursday 19th January off their normal timetable working on projects associated with the site and investigating medieval themes leading from it.

ARCHAEOLOGY AND THE COMPUTER

Using data collected by the archaeologists at Hob's Moat, with the help of computers, to draw charts and plans of the site, in the hope of making some 'discoveries'.

LOCAL HISTORY

An investigation into aspects of the History of Solihull in the Middle Ages using documents and making other local visits.

GEOGRAPHICAL CROSS-SECTIONAL MODEL-MAKING

Using the contour map produced by the archaeologists to build a three dimensional model of the moat.

COMMUNITY SURVEY

Interviewing residents and Officers of the Council to investigate the future role of the site as a Borough amenity.

HERALDRY

Researching, making and hanging banners and shields of medieval arms.
